5. Planning Applications:

PA21/01480 Poundstock (Poundstock Electoral Division) Land West if the A39 Poundstock Bude Cornwall Construction of a crematorium with associated access, landscaping and infrastructure – N/A The Atlantic View Crematorium Consortium – PA21/01480 (Case Officer James Hills).

The adverse impact of granting permission would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits when assessed against the policies in the National Planning Policy Framework when taking material considerations into account.

The proposal was considered to be an inappropriate development and would have a negative impact upon the beauty and diversity of the landscape and seascape and openness character of the area in failing to identify the value, sensitivity and importance of the landscape. Conserving the landscape character and

natural beauty directly within the buffer zone of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) is of significant importance, as being within the Area of Great Landscape Value (AGLV), Heritage Coast and Special Scientific Interest (SSI).

The viability and sustainability of neighbouring and local self-catering holiday businesses and camp/caravan sites and farming businesses could potentially be severely adversely affected.

The highways impact of increased traffic on the road junction with the A39 has not been clearly demonstrated, furthermore the road is susceptible to flooding.

Furthermore, it was noted a commercial business plan was not provided bringing sustainability and viability of the proposed development in to question.
